

1997

The state legislature authorizes funding for a Consultant to engage with tribes and support school districts on Indian education.

2007

The University of Nevada-Reno and the Nevada Indian Commission host the inaugural American Indian/Alaska Native **Education Summit**

2012

The Nevada State Board of Education adopts a statewide curriculum on Indian education.

2017

The Department of **Education approves** the Nevada state plan to implement the Every Student Succeeds Act.

2021

Nevada waives fees for students who are members or descendants of Nevada's federally recognized tribes at Nevada System of **Higher Education** institutions.

2023

Nevada Bill AB73, signed into law protects Native Students Right to wear Native Regalia and items of Religious and cultural Significance
