This expanded list of eligible entities will allow for more tribal entities to support Native students.

GRANTS TO LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES AND TRIBES: ESSA has new language around providing formula grants for cooperative agreements between an LEA and an Indian tribe to carry out Title VI activities. This is important for tribes who want to exercise greater autonomy in administering Title VI programs.

This new language also holds LEAs more accountable by requiring them to describe the actions that were taken based on this collaborative process within the application before submission.

SEC. 6114 ASSURANCES section expands to include more stakeholders that are required to be consulted with in the development of the comprehensive program to include: Family members Representatives of Indian tribes on Indian lands located within 50 miles of any school that the agency will serve if such tribes have any children in such school, and Indian organizations. 	ESSA expands the list of individuals who are to be consulted with regarding the development of the comprehensive program. This allows for greater tribal representation.

Education Partnership (STEP)	SEC. 7135 This section made grants available to tribes and tribal organizations for the development of tribal departments of education.	SEC. 6132 Includes new language on the grant program that allows eligible entities to carry out specific educational activities throughout the law.	GRANTS TO TRIBES FOR EDUCATION ADMINISTRATIVE PLANNING, DEVELOPMENT, AND COORDINATION: • ESSA has stronger language around eligible entities to carry out specific educational activities throughout the law. This language acknowledges the importance of tribal authority in educating their students.
Improvement of Educational Opportunities for Adult Indians	SEC. 7136 This section authorized that the Secretary provide grants to improve literacy skills and educational and employment opportunities for Indian adults. NATIVE AMERICAN AND ALASKA NATIVE LANGUAGE IMMERSION SCHOOLS AND PROGRAMS. • ESSA establishes a language immersion grant program, which NCLB does not. This addition is an acknowledgement from Congress of the critical role language plays in providing Native students a quality and culture based education.

NATIVE HAWAIIAN EDUCATION COUNCIL AND ISLAND COUNCILS: NHEC is to hold community consultations not less than once on each of the islands of Hawaii, Maui, Molokai, Lanai, Oahu, and Kauai. The purpose of this public meeting is to allow the Council to gather input on current grantees, priorities and needs of the community, and to discuss Native Hawaiian education concerns.

SEC. 6304 Elaborates on the entities that may apply for grants and contracts under this section.	 PROGRAM AUTHORIZED: The Alaska Native education program in ESSA increases opportunities for leadership and participation by Alaska Natives in the planning and management of the grant program. Eligible entities must now either have direct experience working with Alaska Native students or work in partnership with or be sanctioned by an Alaska Native organization or tribe.
	SEC. 7304 No applicable language on MANDATORY ACTIVITIES.	SEC. 6304 Includes new section titled, "MANDATORY ACTIVITIES," which consist of the following: 1. The development and implementation of plans, methods, strategies, and activities to improve the educational outcomes of Alaska Natives. 2. The collection of data to assist in the evaluation of the programs carried out under this grant.	PROGRAM AUTHORIZED: • Two activities have become mandatory under ESSA. These activities emphasize strategies to improve educational outcomes of Alaska Natives and data collection of the programs administered under this grant.
